The National Policy on Education formulated in 1986 and modified in 1992 & 2020 aims to develop good human beings capable of rational thought and action, possessing compassion and empathy, courage and resilience, scientific temper and creative imagination, with sound ethical moorings and values. It aims at producing engaged, productive, and contributing citizens for building an equitable, inclusive, and plural society as envisaged by our Constitution.

According to "Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009", it is proposed to provide free and compulsory education to all children up to 14 years of age and to disabled children up to 18 years of age. The Directorate of Education earnestly endeavors to implement the policy. As per the Maharashtra Municipal Corporation Act Nashik Municipal Corporation is performing a duty of providing school education in accordance with the provisions of the Bombay Primary Education Act, 1947. The educational facilities are provided in stages i.e., pre-primary, primary, upper primary, secondary, higher secondary and university level. Pre-primary, primary, upper primary & secondary educations are mainly the responsibility of the Municipal Corporation of Nashik.

Nashik Municipal Corporation consists of **88 primary schools & 12 Secondary schools** across the city and enrolls around **29000 students**.
